Standard Lithium has purchased 118 acres of land in Lafayette County with plans to build the highest capacity lithium extraction plant in Lafayette and Columbia County. Union County has the 2nd highest rates with the closing of El Dorado Paper Bag Production Company located in Union County. Three Dollar General stores opened in El Dorado, Arkansas, located in Union County.

The median income for Union County continues to show its need for our programs with an average of \$50,202. The data for all our counties functions below the median rate in both Arkansas and the United States. The median income for the State of Arkansas is \$55,432, which is the second lowest in the United States. The United States median is \$74,580.

Education

How does Education affect poverty? For starters it can end it. Access to high-quality primary education and supporting child well-being is a globally recognized solution to the cycle of poverty. This is, in part, because it also addresses many of the other issues that keep communities vulnerable.

Education is often referred to as the great equalizer: It can open the door to jobs, resources, and skills that help a person not only survive, but thrive. In fact, according to UNESCO, if all students in low-income countries had just basic reading skills (nothing else), an estimated 171 million people could escape extreme poverty. If all adults completed secondary education, we could cut the global poverty rate by more than half.

At its core, a quality education supports a child's development of social, emotional, cognitive, and communication skills. Children who attend school also gain knowledge and skills, often at a higher level than those who aren't in the classroom. In early 2023, ExxonMobil acquired the rights to 120,000 gross acres of the Smackover formation in southern Arkansas – considered one of the most prolific lithium resources of its type in North America. Lithium is essential to the production of lithium-ion batteries, which are used in electric vehicles, consumer electronics, energy storage systems and other clean energy technologies. Demand for lithium is expected to quadruple by 2030, and virtually all lithium today is produced outside of North America.

El Dorado Packaging, before it was purchased by ProAmPac in 2021, owned the El Dorado facility along with facilities in Nebraska and Minnesota, according to a press release that announced the acquisition. Few details were offered by the company related to the closing of the El Dorado facility, which employs from 85 to 100 people. ProAmPac focuses on manufacturing packaging products and owns facilities in the U.S., the U.K., Canada, Germany, Switzerland, Ireland and southeast Asia, according to their website.
