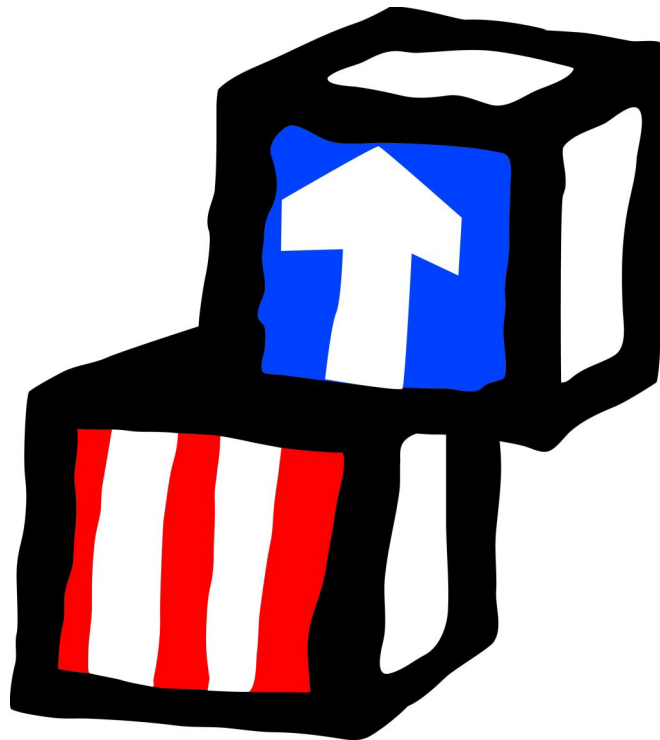

The purpose of the Arkansas WIC Program (Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children) is to improve the nutrition of eligible pregnant, breastfeeding and postpartum women, infants and young children during periods of critical growth. The Program provides electronic benefit cards (eWIC) for specific foods that participants redeem at local grocery stores, nutrition education and referrals to other services.

Pregnant, breastfeeding and postpartum women, infants and children under age five are eligible for WIC if they:

- **Live in Arkansas.** There is no waiting period to meet the residency requirement.
- **Meet income guidelines.** These guidelines are set at 185% of poverty. Applicants must provide proof of household income. Recipients of Medicaid, ARKids First, TEA and/or SNAP (Food Stamps) may be automatically income eligible for WIC.
- **Are nutritionally eligible.** Conditions such as anemia, certain medical disorders, weight (underweight, overweight, pattern of gain or loss, weight in relation to height, etc.), number and frequency of pregnancies, and inappropriate nutrition practices are some of the factors considered in a nutritional assessment. This assessment is performed by a nurse, nutritionist or physician in the Local (County) Health Unit.

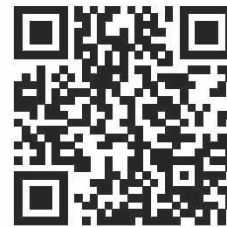

El propósito del Programa WIC de Arkansas (Programa especial de nutrición complementaria para mujeres, bebés y niños) es mejorar la nutrición de mujeres embarazadas, lactantes y en posparto, y de infantes y niños durante los períodos cruciales de crecimiento, si reúnen los requisitos necesarios. Este programa proporciona tarjetas electrónicas de beneficios (eWIC) para obtener determinados alimentos que los participantes pueden canjear en tiendas de abarrotes locales, así como información sobre nutrición y derivaciones a otros servicios.

Las mujeres embarazadas, lactantes y en posparto, y los bebés y niños menores de 5 años pueden participar en WIC si:

- **Viven en Arkansas.** No se requiere cumplir con un tiempo de espera para cumplir con el requisito de residencia.
- **Cumplen con los requisitos de ingreso.** Estos requisitos han sido fijados a un 185% de pobreza. Los solicitantes deben proporcionar prueba del ingreso familiar. Aquellos que reciban los beneficios de Medicaid, ARKids First, TEA o SNAP (bonos de alimentos) podrían calificar de manera automática para WIC debido a sus ingresos.
- **Son elegibles nutricionalmente.** Algunos de los factores que se toman en cuenta durante una evaluación nutricional son: anemia, ciertos trastornos médicos, peso (bajo peso, sobrepeso, patrón de aumento o pérdida, peso en relación a la estatura, etc.), cantidad y frecuencia de embarazos, y prácticas inapropiadas de nutrición. Una enfermera, un nutricionista o un médico llevan a cabo estas evaluaciones en la Unidad de Salud Local (condado).

Los alimentos provistos a niños y mujeres pueden incluir:

- Leche
- Queso
- Jugo
- Cereal fortificado con hierro
- Frijoles o guisantes secos o enlatados

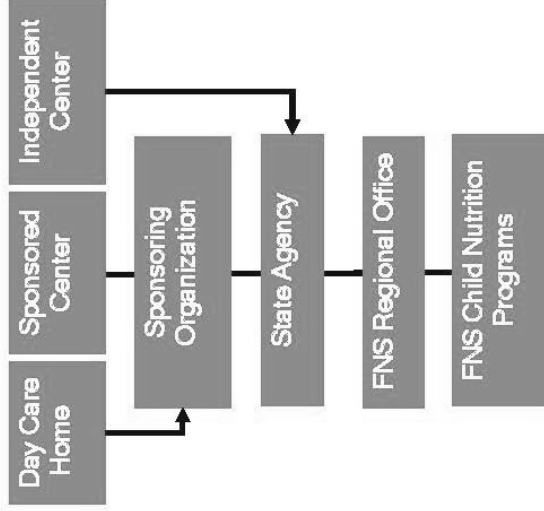

What is CACFP?

CACFP is the Child and Adult Care Food Program. It is a Federal program that pays for healthy meals and snacks for children and adults in day care.

CACFP improves the quality of day care. It makes the cost of day care cheaper for many low-income families.

Besides providing meals in day care,, CACFP makes afterschool programs more appealing to at-risk children and youth. Serving afterschool meals and snacks attracts students to learning activities that are safe and fun.

Children and youth who are homeless can also receive meals at shelters that participate in CACFP.

Who is eligible for CACFP meals?

- Children under age 13,
- Migrant children under age 16,
- Children and youth under age 19 in after school program in low income areas
- Children and youth under age 19 who live in homeless shelters, and
- Adults who are impaired or over age 60 and enrolled in adult day care.

What kinds of meals are served?

CACFP meals follow USDA nutrition standards.

- Breakfast consists of milk, fruits or vegetables, and grains.
- Lunch and Supper require milk, grains, meat or other proteins, fruits, and vegetables.
- Snacks include two different servings from the five components: milk, fruits, vegetables, grains, or meat or other proteins.

Where are CACFP meals served?

Many types of facilities participate in CACFP.

Child Care Centers:

Licensed child care centers and Head Start programs provide day care with meals and snacks to large numbers of children.

Outside-School-Hours Care Centers:

Licensed centers offer before or afterschool care with meals and snacks to large numbers of school-aged children.

Family Day Care Homes:

Licensed providers offer family child care with free meals and snacks to small groups of children in private homes.

"At-Risk" Afterschool Care Programs:

Centers in low-income areas provide learning activities with free meals and snacks to school-age children and youth.

Emergency Shelters:

Homeless, domestic violence, and runaway youth shelters provide places to live with free meals for children and youth.

Adult Day Care Centers:

Licensed centers provide day care with meals and snacks to enrolled adults.

Also, many local churches provide various types of help including food banks, shelter and clothing.
